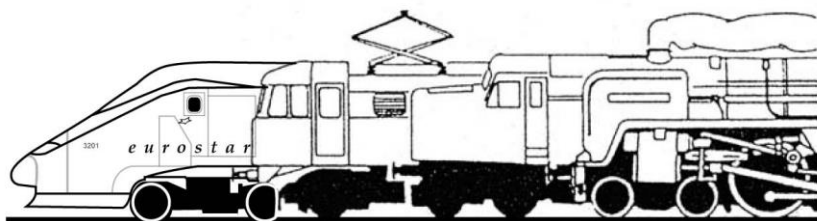

Directions: St Cyprian's Church is a 1903 brick-built establishment with some fascinating wooden screen carving. There is no parking available outside. The nearest TfL station is **Baker Street**. Leave the station on the western side and cross Baker Street itself to Melcombe Street. Glentworth Street is second on the right and the church is at the far end. From **Marylebone** leave the station and turn left. Continue past Dorset Square and cross Gloucester Place. Glentworth Street is first on the left.
